

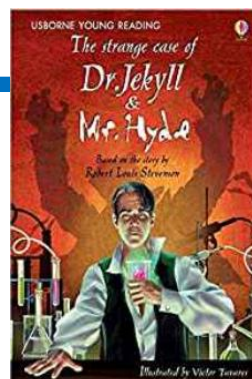
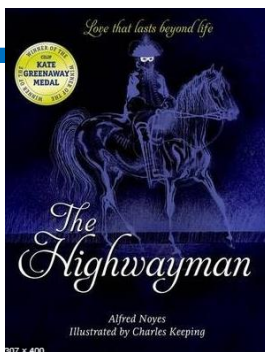
IN SPRING B WE WILL BE LEARNING:

In history this term, pupils will be learning about crime and punishment over time and how it has changed. We will be having a super learning day on the 22nd February, where the children will study a real life case from the Anglo-Saxon period and decide on the punishment that will fit the crime for that period. Also the children will have the opportunity to speak to a member of the community who is a lawyer and ask questions about the workings of a court. In English we are linking our learning by reading a narrative poem called 'The Highwayman' and writing character and setting descriptions. Using this book as a stimulus, in art we will be using printing to highlight the features of the setting and characters from the book. Year 5 will also continue to develop a greater understanding of the Earth and space in Science. Maths will be focused on fractions, decimals and percentages. Alongside this, students will also be learning about Hindu beliefs in RE, E-safety in ICT and in music we will be having a go at performing our own rap.



READING TO SUPPORT OUR LEARNING:

During Guided Reading this half term, the children in Year 5 will be doing a book study on 'The Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde' and in English 'The Highwayman' by Alfred Noyes. They will be having discussions about the text and looking at the different character descriptions, sharing their ideas on what they think makes it an effective piece of writing.



WHAT YOU CAN DO AT HOME TO SUPPORT THE LEARNING:

- Encourage children to access home learning through Class Dojo, Microsoft TEAMS, MyOn and Sumdog. (You should have log-in details for all of these but if you need them to be re-sent or if you need help with anything, please get in touch with your child's teacher).
- Ensure children return online learning as soon as it is completed and at the very latest, before 4pm on the day it is set, to ensure they receive useful feedback.
- Encourage children to attend live check-ins on Microsoft TEAMS every day at 9:15am and 1:15pm
- Encourage and support your child to read at least 3 x per week and sign their reading record.
- Urge children to practise spelling and times tables regularly.
